It was adopted.

Mr. Stevens submitted the following amendment.

Line 5, after the word "each," insert "as soon after the passage of this bill as may be compatible with the interests of the State, and also, the further sum of two thousand dollars each, when all the cases of the State against the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, involving the question of Capitation Tax shall reach a final decision in the Court of last resort, if they shall conduct said cases therein, or in case of a final adjustment of said controversy."

Which was adopted.

Said bill as amended was then read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading

On motion by Mr. Phelps,
