Mr. Cooper, from Select Committee, reported unfavorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to provide for the opening and extension of Camden or Conway street, in the City of Baltimore.

Mr. Walsh, from Select Committee, reported favorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal an Act passed January Session, 1874, chapter 42, relating to fish and fisheries, and to enact a substitute therefor.

Which was read the first time.

Senate Joint Resolutions protesting against that Section of the Morrison Tariff bill, now pending in Congress, by which bituminous coal is placed on the free list, as being destructive to an important interest of this State,

Were read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading,

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 81, of Article 14, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Kent County," sub-title "County Commissioners," and to amend and re-enact the same with amendments, and to add a sub-section thereto, and to provide for the appointment of two County
