Was ordered to be printed.

Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize the Commissioner of the Land Office, to continue the indexing of certain Land Records, and extracts of deeds transferred to the Land Office, from the Office of the Clerk of the Court of Appeals, under the Act of 1874, chapter 66.

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claims of divers editors of newspapers in the State of Maryland, for publishing the Act of January Session 1874, chap. 364, entitled "an Act to amend Sec. 8, of Art. 4, of the Constitution of the State of Maryland."

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to promote the security of commercial transactions, by regulating the issue, negotiability and transfer of bills of lading, storage receipts, and like commercial instruments, by defining the rights of the holders thereof, and by preventing and punishing improper dealings with the same or with the goods covered thereby.

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
