Memorial of John Hanson Hilleary, H. T. Deaver, C. P. Crampton and 30 others, citizens of Frederick county, praying the passage of a law imposing a tax of one dollar on every voter, of one dollar on his dog, and of one dollar on every other dog that he may choose to keep.

Memorial of Mr. Merrick and 20 others, citizens of Talbot county, praying that the Constitution be so amended, that no person shall have a right to vote unless they pay a poll-tax of one dollar.

Memorial of R. J. W. Carey and 100 others, citizens of Caroline county, to amend the State Constitution, providing for a poll-tax.
