Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance, to introduce a bill for the promotion of agricultural, mechanical and household arts in Harford and Kent counties.

On motion by Mr. Gorman,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 2, of an Act entitled an Act to limit the hours of labor in this State for all minors under sixteen years of age, passed at January session, 1874, Chapter 3, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to introduce a bill to repeal Section 20 of the Public General Laws, relating to Attorneys, and to re-enact the same with amendments.
