

this law shall be taken or held to authorize or justify any trespass or injury done to the lands or crops of any owner or possessor thereof, by the entry or intrusion thereon of any live stock of any other person, or to bar the recovery of damages therefor as now allowed by law."

Which were adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was then read the second time.

Mr. Gorman, from the Committee on Finance, reported favorably,
