Which were read and referred to the Baltimore city Senators.

Mr. McCulloh presented the memorial of R. R. Sauner and 55 others, citizens of Allegany county, protesting against the passage of the bill restricting the operations of Building Associations in this State.

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Mr. Steiner,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to incorporate the Washington city and Atlantic Coast Railroad Company.

On motion by Mr. Walsh,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations, to introduce a bill to repeal chapter 163, of the Session, 1866, entitled "an Act to incorporate the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Federalsburg, in Caroline county," and to enact a substitute in lieu thereof.

On motion by Stevens,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to introduce a bill entitled "an Act to authorize the Protestant Infant Asylum of Baltimore city," to bind out and control the children under its care.

On motion by Mr. Suit,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to add an additional Section to the Code of Public General Laws, Article 30, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Witnesses."

On motion by Mr. Lloyd,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Lloyd, Walsh and McCulloh, to introduce a bill to enable the qualified voters of Caroline county, to determine by ballot whether or not license shall be granted to sell spirituous or fermented liquors in said county.
