Mr. Stevens presented the memorial of the President and Trustees of the Maryland Inebriate Asylum.

Mr. Freeman presented the memorial of Mary Ann Pearce, widow of Joseph Pearce, a soldier of the war of 1812, praying that a pension be granted her.
