Senate bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claims of divers editors of newspapers in this State for publishing the Act entitled an Act to amend Section 8, of Article 4, of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, passed at January Session, 1874, authorized and directed by the Governor, under the provisions of Section 1, Article 14, of of the Constitution and proclamation of the Governor, announcing the adoption of the amendment by the people.
