House bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 5 of Article 13 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Bastardy and Fornication," and, also, to add additional Sections to said Article.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

House bill entitled an Act to authorize the Comptroller to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for a sum sufficient to reimburse Sprigg Harwood, for money erroneously paid into the State Treasury, and to direct said Sprigg Harwood to pay the same, when so re-imbursed, to the County School Commissioners for Anne Arundel county.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

House bill entitled an Act to provide for maintaining and keeping in repair the public roads in Dochester county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Phelps, Aydelotte and Gorman.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 2 of chapter 99 of the Acts of 1874, and to re-enact the same with amendments.
