On motion by Mr. Stevens,

Ordered, That the Secretary be directed to return to the House of Delegates the House bill in relation to the appropriation for the celebration of the Centennial.

On motion by Mr. Lee,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance to introduce a bill to repeal the Act of 1870, chap. 466, relating to the distribution of the Academic fund in Carroll county, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

On motion by Mr. Aydelotte,

Leave was granted to the Worcester, Somerset and Wicomico delegations to introduce a bill to repeal Section 30 of Article 28 of the Code Supplement of 1868, Public General Laws, as enacted by Section 3 of chapter 29, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, 1868, so far as the said Section relates to Worcester county, and to re-enact the same with amendments, to apply only to Worcester county.
