EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, Annapolis, March 17th, 1876.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

I have the honor of informing you, that I have approved and signed the following Acts, which originated in the Senate:

No. 70. An Act to provide for the payment of the counsel employed to represent the State in the arbitration between Maryland and Virginia, upon the boundary between the said States, and to appropriate a sum of money therefor, and for the other expenses of the said arbitration.

No. 80. An Act to amend the Act passed at this present Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, chapter 334, approved March 30th, 1868, entitled an Act supplementary and amendatory of an Act passed at the present Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, entitled an Act to amend the charter of the Cumberland and Pennsylvania.
