Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to introduce a bill to add a new Section to Art. 26, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to corporations, providing for a more summary process against Companies incorporated in this State, with authority to transport persons or property for hire.

Also, by Mr. Gorman,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations, to introduce a bill to incorporate the Savage Manufacturing Company

On motion by Mr. Bannon,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Bannon, Humphreys and Lawrence, to introduce a bill authorizing and directing the County Commissioners to widen and straighten the county road from Hooversville to Odenton, in Anne Arundel county.

On motion by Mr. Joyce,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore City Senators, to introduce a bill to regulate gas-metres in the City of Baltimore.

On motion by Mr. Stevens,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money for the Maryland Inebriate Asylum.

Also, by Mr. Stevens,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore City Senators, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to authorize appropriations by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, for the benefit of corporations duly charged with the custody of juvenile delinquents.

Senate bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money for the repair and improvement of the State House.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 4 of Art. 81, of the Code of Public General Laws, as the same was enacted by ch. 483 of the Acts of 1874, and to enact a new Section in lieu of the Section so repealed.

Mr. Joyce, from Select Committee, reported favorably, Senate bill entitled an Act to regulate gas-metres in the City of Baltimore.
