Add after word "established," in line 20, Section 4, the following: "That any one who is not registered on or beiore the day of election, may be entitled to vote, whether he be registered or not, by making affidavit in due form of law; that he possesses the requisite qualifications as prescribed by the Constitution and laws of the State to vote at said election, the truth of which must be certified to under eath by some one known to the Judge or Judges of Election."
