The vote by which said bill failed to receive a Constitutional majority was reconsidered.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal ch. 466 of the Acts of 1870, entitled an Act to distribute the Academic and High School Fund of Carroll county, to the Western Maryland College and Manchester Academy, in Carroll county, and to enact a substitute therefor,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize and empower the County Commissioners of Harford county, to refund to the executor of Edward Painter, late of said county, taxes paid in error,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal Sec. 56 of an Act passed at the January Session, 1866, title "Kent County," sub-title "Chestertown," and to re-enact the same with amendments.
