Leave was granted to Messrs. Freeman, Newcomer and Duke, to introduce a bill to repeal chap. 371, of the laws of 1872, and Section 63 to 77 inclusive, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Baltimore county, Article 3, entitled "County Commissioners," and insert the following in lieu thereof.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill to regulate the admission of attorneys to practice law in the Courts of this State.

On motion by Mr. Aydelotte,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Aydelotte, Dennis and Humphreys, to introduce a bill to authorize the County Commissioners of Somerset and Worcester counties, to purchase the Pocomoke Bridge Stock, if such purchase can be made without loss to the tax-payers of the two counties.
