BY THE SENATE,

March 22nd, 1876.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We have received your message informing us that you have non-concurred in certain amendments of the Senate, to House bill No. 224, making further appropriations for the support of the government and schools, and reformatory institutions for 1876, and requesting the Senate to recede from the same. After consideration, the Senate has determined to adhere to its amendments, and request your Honorable Body to appoint a Committee of Conference to take into consideration the disagreeing votes of the two Houses.
