The following Senate bills having passed both branches of the General Assembly of Maryland, were this day presented to his Excellency, the Governor, for his approval:

No. 115. An Act granting additional powers to the Potomac Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore.

No. 116. An Act supplementary to an Act passed at January Session, 1852, entitled an Act to incorporate the Santa Clara Mining Association of Baltimore, authorizing said Association to make and enforce payment of all calls, or assessments upon its capital stock heretofore made, or hereafter to be made.

No. 117. An Act to appoint an additional Justice of the Peace for the State of Maryland, in and for Somerset county, and in the Eighth Election District.

No. 118. An Act supplementary to an Act to incorporate the Citizens' Railway Company of Baltimore city, passed at the January Session, 1870.

No. 119. An Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claims of divers editors of newspapers in the State of Maryland, for publishing the Act entitled an Act to amend Section 8, of Article 4, of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, passed at January Session, 1874, authorized and directed by the Governor, under the provisions of Section 1, Article 14, of the Constitution and Proclamation of the Governor, announcing the adoption of the amendment by the people.

No. 137. An Act to repeal Section 2, chapter 99, passed
