

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Add to Section 1: "To I. Nevitt Steele fifty-three dollars, for printing, paid in suits of State vs. B. & O. R. R.; and to John Murphy & Co., one hundred and ten dollars and seventy-five cents, for printing briefs, in suits of State vs. B. & O. R. R."

Which was adopted.

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates appeared, and delivered the following bills:

House bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 4, of chapter 274, of the Acts of 1860, entitled an Act to incorporate the Baltimore and Liberty Turnpike Company, and to enact a substitute therefor.

Which was read the first time and referred to Committee on Corporations.

House bill entitled an Act to provide for the regulation of the sale of spirituous and fermented liquors in Cecil county.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

House bill entitled an Act to regulate the sale of seats in Theatres, Concerts or Lecture Halls and other places of public entertainment.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

House bill entitled an Act to refund to Zadok Marshall, late Collector of Worcester county, the sum of \$75.22, by him heretofore paid in to the Treasury.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

House bill entitled an Act to authorize Benjamin Lankford to erect and keep a gate across a county road in Somerset county.
