Mr. Lloyd, from Committee on Conference, submitted the following REPORT:

The Committee on Conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, on House bill No. 79, have had the same under consideration, and recommend to their respective bodies, that the House concur in so much of the second amendment of the Senate as refers to the appropriation for the Lying-in Hospital for Indigent Women, and that the Senate recede from so much as refers to the Aged Womens' Home.

That the Senate recede from the third amendment, and in-

sert in lieu thereof, twenty-seven thousand dollars.

Which was read and adopted. Said bill was then read the third time and passed by yeas and nays as follows:
