Sheriffs of the several counties at least 48 hours before the opening of the polls at the election next ensuing."

Amendment to 19th Section, strike out "one day," and insert "two days" in lieu thereof, just before the words "after the close of the polls."

Section 20, line 2, strike out the word "two," and insert the word "five."

Section 20, line 4, strike out the words "one hundred and

fifty," and insert the words "five hundred."

Amend Section 21, after the words "duties upon him," by inserting "or it any Officer of Registration shall enter upon the list of registered voters the name of a voter, or strike from said list the name of any person already entered thereon, except at the time and place prescribed by this Act."

"Strike out Sec. 22."

Insert after the word "office," in 7th line, the words "for the purposes mentioned in this Section."
