The Clerk of the House of Delegates appeared and delivered the following bills:

House bill entitled an Act to declare the Monday, immediately preceding Tuesday, the Fourth day of July, 1876, a legal holiday.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

House bill entitled an Act for the promotion of Agricultural Mechanical and Household Arts, in Harford, Kent and Howard counties.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Walsh, Hepbron and Gorman.

House bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Montgomery and Prince George's counties, to appoint examiners to report to their respective County Commissioners whether the public convenience requires the building of a bridge over the northeast branch at the point where it is crossed by the Sandy Spring Road.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Brewer, Suit and Mudd.

House bill entitled an Act to add Sections to Article 78, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Refuge House of," for the purpose of providing for the Female House of Refuge.
