"The Auditor after examining all claims against the county, shall lay them before the County Commissioners, a majority of whom, shall approve of the same before payment by the Treasurer."

Same Section, strike all from the word "appeal" in line 22.

Sec. 12, strike out all after the word "refusal" in line 3.

Which were adopted.

Said bill as amended was then read the second time.

Mr. Joyce called the attention of the Senate to an error in endorsement of an amendment offered yesterday, to House Joint Resolutions in relation to the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, by which said amendment was erroneously endorsed "lost," instead of "adopted."

Said Resolutions having been sent to the House of Delegates,

Mr. Stevens submitted the following message:
