Which was read, assented to, and sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Walsh, from Committee on Finance, reported favorably the following bills:

First. House bill entitled an Act to authorize the building of a new Tobacco Warehouse in the City of Baltimore, and to appropriate money for said purpose, with the following proposed amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Section 3, line 10, after word "Comptroller," insert, "and authority is hereby given to the Supervisor of Warehouses, that if it becomes necessary to have more room for the inspection of tobacco than is possessed, until the said new warehouse is built, to rent some convenient and suitable building, until the said new warehouse is completed for the purposes of supplying such necessity."

Which was adopted.

Said bill as amended, was then read the second time.

Second. House bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay Wm. T. Iglehart for work done for the Executive Department, by direction of the late Governor Groome.

Which was read the second time.
