On motion by Mr. Stevens, Said bill was ordered to lie over.

House bill entitled an Act to authorize the building of a new Tobacco Warehouse, in the City of Baltimore, and to appropriate money for said purpose.

"And, provided, that in any contract for building said warehouse the commission shall require bond and retain 10 per cent. of contract price until said building is completed." Which was adopted.

The question recurring upon the amendment, as amended.

It was adopted.
