Insert at end of Sec. 1, "to Isaac M. Denson, due for materials furnished by order of the Weighmaster of Live Stock \$1,250.20."

"To John S. Tracy for amount due him as per certificate of the Comptroller for taxes paid in error, \$16.06."

"To Charles Stinchcumb, policeman, \$5.00 for services at Governor Groome's inauguration."

"To Wm. Kirby, policeman, \$5.00 for services at Gover-

nor Groome's inauguration."

Which were adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was then read the second time.
