

On motion by Mr. Walsh, it was

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Mr. Steiner presented the memorial of G. J. Doll and 58 others, citizens of Frederick city, praying the General Assembly not to repeal the law exempting one-hundred dollars of wages from attachment,
