Mr. Stevens presented the memerial of Wm. P. Maulsby, John M. Brosius, C. H. Keefer and 276 others, citizens of Frederick county and city, praying for the repeal of the Attachment Law of 1874,

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

On motion by Mr. Getty,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Getty, Ford and Lawrence, to introduce a bill to repeal an Act, chapter 506, of the Laws of 1874, entitled an Act for the taxation of dogs, so far as the same relates to Garrett county.

On motion by Mr. Lloyd,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Lloyd, Ford and Walsh, to introduce a bill in reference to shooting wild fowl from sinkboats.

On motion by Mr. Cooper,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore City Senators to introduce a bill to regulate the sale of fire-wood in the City of Baltimore.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill entitled an Act to add new sections to Article 51 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Justices of the Peace," relating to the liens of executions issued by Justices of the Peace, passed March 30th, 1868, chapter 443, and to re-enact the same with amendments.
