The Clerk of the House of Delegates appeared and delivered the following message:

On motion by Mr. Lloyd, it was

Ordered, That if the Senate be convened in extra Session by the Governor, to confirm the appointments required to be made under the assessment bill, passed at the present Session of the Legislature. the Secretary of the Senate, Reading Clerk, Journal Clerk, Sergeant-at-Arms and the Doorkeeper, shall be the only officers of the Senate required to attend said extra Session, and no per diem, mileage or other compensation, whatsoever, be allowed any other officer of the Senate, and that the Chairman of the Committee on Claims, and the Clerk of said Committee be requested to attend.

Mr. Lloyd submitted the following message:

We propose, with the concurrence of your Honorable Body, that the two Houses of the General Assembly adjourn sine die, at 12 o'clock, midnight, the 3rd inst.
