Liber 10—*Rent Roll Vol. 2 Somerset Dorchester No. 2.* Pages 273-569; typed index of tract names. Pagination indicates this and Liber 9 were one volume.

- (1) Somerset Rent Roll. Pages 273-342 (pp. 330-335 are remarked as being copied here by mistake instead of in the Additional Rent Roll—Liber 45); entries on lands patented up to 1730; alienations to 1772.
- (2) Dorchester Rent Roll. Pages 343-569 (pp. 566-9 are remarked as being copied here by mistake instead of in the Additional Rent Roll—Liber 29); entries on lands patented between 1659 and 1730; alienations to 1772.

Liber 11—*Rent Roll Vol. 1 Talbot Queen Anne No.1.* Pages 4-287; entries on lands in Talbot County patented up to 1775, including Additional Rent Rolls from 1734 to 1775; pp. 285-7 has the names, acreages and owners of lands patented 1782-1790; typed index of tract names. Pagination and title of this volume indicate that it and the following Liber 12 were once bound together in one volume.

Liber 12—*Rent Roll Vol. 2 Talbot Queen Anne No.2.* Pages 297-562; entries on lands in Queen Anne's County patented up to 1750, including Additional Rent Rolls from 1734-1750; alienations to 1772; typed index of tract names.⁸⁰

Liber 12A—*Talbot and Queen Anne Counties Rent Roll No. 3.* 165 pages; typed index of tract names; entries on lands patented in Queen Anne's County up to 1755. This volume and Libers 25 and 37 are unique in this series in having entries arranged alphabetically according to the name of the person paying the rent. No alienations.

Liber 13—*Rent Roll Anne Arundel No. 3.* 132 pages; typed index of tract names; title page: "Anne Arundel County Rent Roll Lib. No. 2 Anno 1756;" entries on lands patented from 1753 to 1768 (pp. 1-69), additional annual rent rolls from 1769 to 1775 (pp. 70-124) and names, owners and acreages of tracts patented between 1782 and 1790. Alienations to 1776.
