

p. 1-33, Liber N, contains "Probatts of wills and Letters of Administration with other Businesses concerning Testamentary Causes", Nov. 15, 1659-Apr. 27, 1659[60].

p. 34-55, Liber D, p. 1-22, contents similar to above volume, Aug. 18, 1658-Mar. 23, 1658[9]. This volume, which, of course, should precede the volume above, is the first book to be devoted exclusively to testamentary business.

IC, Liber M or No. 4, p. 1-86, contains all types of testamentary material, Dec. 12, 1660-June 11, 1662.

ID, Liber T or No. 5, p. 1-182, contents similar to above, Mar. 25, 1662-Apr. 2, 1664.

IE, Liber W or No. 6, p. 1-159, contents similar to above, Aug. 20, 1663-Sept. 30, 1665.

IF, Liber GG or No. 7, p. 1-125, contents similar to above, Oct. 20, 1665-July 27, 1666.

Testamentary Proceedings 2, Liber H or No. 8, p. 1-475, contents similar to above, July 8, 1666-June 19, 1668.

Testamentary Proceedings 3, Liber HH or No. 9, p. 1-344, contents similar to above, June 20, 1668-Mar. 26, 1670.

Testamentary Proceedings 4, composed of the following volumes bound together by the Commissioners of 1716:

4A, Liber SS or No. 10, p. 1-57, contains proceedings of a judicial nature only, largely citations and trials of libels, Oct. 2, 1669-Oct. 29, 1674.

4B, Liber No. 11, contents similar to above volume, Aug. 10, 1674-May 3, 1677.

4C, Liber No. 12, contents similar to above volume, May 16, 1677-May 3, 1678.

Testamentary Proceedings 5, Liber No. a, p. 1-545, contains wills, inventories, accounts and other proceedings of a non-judicial nature, Nov. 9, 1670-Sept. 2, 1673.

Testamentary Proceedings 6, Liber P. C. No. C, p. 1-518, contents similar to above volume, Sept. 2, 1673-June 18, 1675.

Testamentary Proceedings 7, Liber No. 13, p. 1-364, contents similar to above volume, except that inventories and accounts were now being recorded in a separate volume, June 18, 1675-Mar. 21, 1675[6].⁵¹
