

“ fice of judge of the faid election according to the  
 “ beft of my knowledge, without favour, affection,  
 “ or partiality;” and every candidate, or any three  
 voters, fhall have a right to object to any perfon of-  
 fering to vote, and to have the objection entered on  
 the poll, if it be over-ruled; and every clerk of an  
 election, before he enters any vote on the polls, fhall  
 take the following oath, or affirmation, to wit: “ I,  
 “ A. B do swear, or affirm, that I will well and  
 “ faithfully, without favour, affection, or partiality,  
 “ execute the office of clerk of the election for ——  
 “ county, the city of Annapolis, or Baltimore-town,  
 “ according to the beft of my knowledge.”

IV. That all perfons, with the exception in the fe-  
 venth fection herein after expreffed, qualified by the  
 charter of the city of Annapolis to vote for burgeffes,  
 fhall, on the fame firft Monday of Oétober, feventeen  
 hundred and ninety-four, and on the fame day in  
 every fecond year for ever thereafter, elect, *viva voce*,  
 by a majority of votes, two delegates, qualified agree-  
 able to the faid charter; that the mayor, recorder and  
 aldermen, of the faid city, or any three of them, be  
 judges of the election, appoint the place in the faid city  
 for holding the fame, and may adjourn from day to  
 day as aforefaid, and fhall make return thereof as  
 aforefaid; but the inhabitants of the faid city fhall  
 not be entitled to vote for delegates for Anne Arundel  
 county, unlefs they have a freehold of fifty acres of  
 land in the county, diftinct from the city.

V. That all perfons, inhabitants of Baltimore-town,  
 and having the fame qualifications as electors in the  
 county, fhall, on the fame firft Monday of Oétober,  
 feventeen hundred and ninety-four, and on the fame  
 day
