Chapter 73.

AN ACT to add additional sections to the Code of Public Local Laws, article, entitled Garrett county, enacted by the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter one hundred and eight, said section to be sub-titled "Thistles," to come after sub-sections seventy-five in said act, and to be numbered seventy-five A, seventy-five B, seventy-five C.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the following sections be and are hereby added to the Code of Public Local Laws, article..., entitled Garrett county, as enacted by the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter one hundred and eight, said sections to be sub-titled "Thistles," and to come after sub-section seventy-five in said act, and to be numbered seventy-five A, seventy-five B, seventy-five C, as follows:

Sections added

Not to grow Cánada thistles

Penalty for violation.

Seventy-five A. No land owner or tenant of any land owner in Garrett county shall permit any Canada thistles to grow upon the land owned or rented by him as the case may be.

Seventy-five B. If any such land owner or tenant shall permit any Canada thistles to grow on the land so owned or rented by him, he shall be fined a sum of not less than one nor more than ten dol-

lars for every day he shall permit the same to grow or remain standing on his land after they shall have developed sufficiently to show that they are Canada thistles, such fine to be recovered before any justice of the peace, as other small fines are now recovered, and the proceeds of such fines to be paid to the

County Commissioners of said county.

Road Supervisor not to permit to grow on public road Seventy-five C. No road supervisor in said county shall permit any such Canada thistle to grow upon any land belonging to any public road in said county, adjoining or being part of any road under his charge; and if any such supervisor shall permit the same, he shall be liable to the fine provided in subsection seventy-five B hereof, to be recovered for the use of said county as provided in said last preceding section.
