Chapter 93.

AN ACT to change the dividing lines between the sixth and ninth election districts of Montgomery county.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the territory embraced within the following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning on the Gaithersburg and Barnesville road, where the same is crossed by Gunners branch, thence down and with sair Gunners branch to Great Seneca creek, thence down and with said Great Seneca creek to the mouth of Long Draught branch, thence up and with said Long Draught branch until the same is crossed by the road leading from the Quince orchard school house to the Gaithersburg and Barnesville road, thence with said road leading from said Quince orchard school house to said Gaithersburg and Barnesville road to its intersection with said Gaithersburg and Barnesville road near the St. Rose's Catholic church, thence with said Gaithersburg and Barnesville road in the direction of Barnesville to the place of beginning, and now embraced within the limits of (Darnestown) the sixth election district of Montgomery county, shall hereafter be a part and parcel of (Gaithersburg) the ninth election district of said county, and all people residing within said limits shall have and possess all the rights, privileges and immunities of the citizens of the said (Gaithersburg) ninth election district, and shall be registered as voters at the polls to be held in said (Gaithersburg) ninth election district.
