Arundel county, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

6. The said coroner or justice of the peace in the account of expenses rendered to the County Commissioners for holding such inquest shall include such sum for the said physician as the said coroner or justice and jurors shall deem just, not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, which sum shall, with the other expenses of the inquest, be paid by the county, and which may be decreased or increased, not beyond the limitations herein expressed, by the said County Commissioners, so as to fully compensate said physician for his services; provided, that this section, as hereby amended, shall apply only to Anne Arundel county.

Chapter 96.

AN ACT for the protection of Partridges and Rabbits, and to permit the shooting of Ducks and other Wild Fowls from the shore over decoys; also to pay a bounty upon the heads of Large Hawks and Owls in Kent county.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall not be lawful to shoot or trap any partridges in Kent county between the fifteenth of January and the twenty-fifth of October, nor any rabbits between the twenty-fifth day of December and the twenty-fifth day of October next succeeding, except that they may be trapped and preserved for stocking or breeding purposes.

SEC. 2. Be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful to shoot ducks or other wild fowl from the

shore over decoys in said county.

SEC. 3. Be it further enacted, That any person killing any large hawks or owls in said county shall be entitled to a bounty of fifty cents for each and every hawk or owl killed.

SEC. 4. Be it further enacted, That to obtain such bounty it shall be necessary for the persons
