

**Chapter 104.**

AN ACT to amend section twenty of article fifty-six of the Code of Public General Laws of this State, title "License," sub-title "Hawkers and Pedlars."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section twenty of article fifty-six of the Code of Public General Laws of this State, title "License," sub-title "Hawkers and Pedlars," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Repealed and re-enacted.

20. No hawker or pedlar shall buy for sale out of the State, or buy to trade, barter or sell, or offer to trade, barter or sell within the State, any goods, wares or merchandise, until he shall have first taken out a license for that purpose; but nothing in this section shall apply to hawkers and pedlars of oysters and fish in their unpreserved and natural condition, or of fruits and vegetables perishable in their nature, that are sold in their natural condition in this State.

**Chapter 105.**

AN ACT to incorporate the Trustees of the Maryland Classis of the Reformed church in the United States.

WHEREAS the ministers and elders of the Maryland Classis of the Reformed church in the United States, consisting of citizens of the State of Maryland and the District of Columbia have represented that, by donations, devises, bequests, gifts, grants and otherwise, they expect to be possessed of lands and moneys for benevolent and religious and pious purposes; but the said ministers and elders, as an unincorporated body, will find it very difficult to manage the said lands and moneys in the way best calculated to advance the cause of religion and promote the spread of the gospel; therefore—
