

Chapter 109.

AN ACT to declare the sanction of the General Assembly to a bequest contained in the last will and testament of Elizabeth Philips, late of Frederick county, deceased, to the Methodist Protestant church, of Woodsboro.

Sanction given

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sanction of the General Assembly be and the same is hereby given to a bequest contained in the last will and testament of Elizabeth Philips, late of Frederick county, deceased, which last will and testament was duly admitted to probate in the Orphans' Court of Frederick county, said bequest being three hundred dollars to the Methodist Protestant church of Woodsboro.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Chapter 110.

AN ACT to add an additional section to article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Crimes and Punishments," so as to provide a punishment for the stealing of dogs.

Additional section.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the following section be added to article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Crimes and Punishments."

Taking dogs feloniously.

SEC. 2. Every person convicted of feloniously taking and carrying away any dog or bitch, or as accessory thereto before or after the fact, shall be deemed guilty of the crime of larceny, and shall restore the dog or bitch to the owner thereof, or shall pay to him the value thereof, and shall be sentenced to confinement in jail for not more than three months.
