## Chapter 12.

AN ACT to repeal section six of chapter one hundred and forty-three of the Acts of Assembly, passed at the January session of eighteen hundred and eighty, entitled "An Act for the Better Protection of Partridges, Woodcock and Rabbits, and to prevent Trespassing with Dog or Gun on Private Property in Talbot county."

Repealed.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section six of chapter one hundred and forty-three of the Acts of the General Assembly, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and eighty, be and the same is hereby repealed. Sec. 2. Be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## Chapter 13.

AN ACT supplementary to an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed in 1814, chapter 71, entitled "An Act to Incorporate a Company to make a Turnpike Road from the square in the town of Boonsboro, in Washington county, to Swearingen's Ferry, on the Potomac river."

WHEREAS, under the acts of 1814, chapter 71, entitled "An Act to Incorporate a Company to

make a Turnpike Road from the square in the town of Boonsboro, in Washington county, to Swearingen's Ferry, on the Potomae river," books of subscription to the capital stock of the said company were opened, and subscriptions to said capital stock were duly made and certificates of stock duly issued by the president and managers; and whereas the said company, so incorporated and organized,

did not, and never has completed its road to Swearingen's Ferry, the western terminus named in the

Preamble.
