Chapter 116.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact section one hundred and sixty-seven of article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments, sub-title "Religious Meetings."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section one hundred and sixty-seven of article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments, sub-title "Religious Meetings," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Repealed and re enacted.

SECTION 167. Whosoever shall wilfully interrupt or disturb any religious congregation, society or meeting, or person attending such congregation, society or meeting, by blowing horns, exploding fire-arms, horse racing, noisy, riotous or disorderly conduct or conversation, shall, on conviction before a justice of the peace in the county wherein such offence shall be committed, be fined not less than one dollar nor more than twenty dollars, and be committed to jail until the fine and costs are paid.

Fine for disturbing religious congregations.
