Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Baltimore Medical College, incorporated under the general laws of this State, by charter duly recorded among the records of the Superior Court of Baltimore city, in which appear the names of Harvey L. Byrd, M. D, W. Robert Monroe, M. D., Benjamin F. Leonard, M. D., Henry Froeling, M. D., L. Wheaton Clapp, M. D., Adolph G. Hoen, M. D., and L. Roberts Coates, M. D., as the incorporators thereof; they and their successors shall have perpetual succession as such, and they shall be and are hereby authorized to annex other schools, to confer degrees, and to have and to hold by purchase, gift or otherwise, suitable grounds and buildings thereon for educational, scientific and hospital purposes, not exceeding in value five hundred thousand dollars, subject to the right of the General Assembly to alter or amend this said act, and subject to all the laws of this State relating to corporations applicable thereunto.
