shall be kept by the person in whose favor it is drawn, and be paid out of the first money that shall

come into the treasury belonging thereto.

Sec. 7. Any money that may be in the treasury at the expiration of any year from the levy thereof, over and above paying the damages sustained by the inhabitants of the county in the loss or injury of sheep by dogs, shall be, by the treasurer, on the warrant of the County Commissioners, paid to the Board of Commissioners of Public Schools of Carroll county, to be by them applied to the purpose of

Sec. 8. Any dog kept or staying about a house shall be deemed sufficient evidence of ownership to authorize the collector to return the person inhabiting said house as the owner or possessor of such dog, and any person sending his dog from house to house, or place to place, to avoid the said tax, shall be liable to pay double tax therefor; and every dog not returned shall be deemed to have no owner, and may be killed by any person seeing him run at

Sec. 9. If any dog shall be seen running sheep, any person may kill him; or if any dog shall have been known to worry sheep, and information thereof be given to the owner thereof, if he does not kill such dog, he shall make full compensation for all damages done by it; and any person seeing the dog running at large may kill him.
