trums, notions, patents, secret or pretended inventions and remedies, on the streets, lanes, alleys or sidewalks of the town, and for licensing commercial travelers and all retail dealers non-resident of said town, and shall also have power to pass ordinances for licensing dogs, and to prevent swine, cattle, dogs, geese or other animals from running at large on the streets of said town.

Establish fire department.

SECTION 16. *And be it enacted*, That said commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby authorized and empowered to pass such ordinances as may be necessary for establishing a fire department in said town, and to appoint one or more fire inspectors and to provide the necessary equipments for said fire department, and to levy such taxes upon the property in said town as may be necessary for such purpose not exceeding one hundred dollars per annum.

Taxes—how expended.

SECTION 17. *And be it enacted*, That all taxes collected by the commissioners of said town, after deducting the cost of said fire department and the salary of all officers of said town, shall be expended upon the east and west sides of George's Creek in the same proportion as the taxable basis of said two parts of said town bear to each other.

Chapter 128.

AN ACT to allow time to James Wooters, late clerk of the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's county, to complete the records and other unfinished work in his office at the expiration of his official term.

Further time to complete records.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That James Wooters, late clerk of the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's county, be and he is hereby allowed and granted twelve months from the date of the passage of this act, to bring up and complete all records and other unfinished work remaining unfinished and incomplete in said office at the expiration of his term of office as such clerk,
