Appropriation -- to whom paid

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, For the purpose of properly arranging, editing and publishing the aforesaid documents as hereinbefore provided, as well as other documents pertaining to the history of Maryland, the sum of two thousand dollars is hereby appropriated and shall be paid to the said Maryland Historical Society out of any funds in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, as follows: One thousand dollars thereof upon demand at any time after the aforesaid records, archives and documents shall have been removed and placed in the custody of said society, and the remaining one thousand dollars thereof shall be paid upon demand at any time after the first day of January, eighteen hundred and eighty-three; and provided that all publications made as aforesaid under this act shall belong to the State, but may be sold at cost-price by the said Maryland Historical Society, and the proceeds shall be added to the publication fund established by the appropriation herein made; and further provided, that any or all of said papers may be recalled, and shall be returned to the State on its demand therefor.

Papers may be recalled.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the said Maryland Historical Society to make report to the next General Assembly of the progress of the work herein provided for, and also of all receipts and disbursements made under this act.

Make report of progress.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
