Chapter 139.

AN ACT to repeal section thirteen of article ninetyeight of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Wild Fowl," as amended and re-enacted by chapter four hundred and sixty of the acts passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, so far as the same relates to Dorchester county, and to enact the following in lieu thereof:

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section thirteen of article ninety-eight of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Wild Fowl," as amended and re-enacted by chapter four hundred and sixty of the acts passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy eight, so far as the same relates to Dorchester county, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Section 13. No person shall shoot or in any manner catch, kill or have in possession any partridge between the first day of February (said day included) and the first day of November next ensuing in each and every year; nor any wood cock between the first day of February and the fifteenth day of June; nor any pheasant between the first day of January (said day included) and the fifteenth day of August; nor any rabbit between the fifteenth day of January and the fifteenth day of October; nor shall any person trap or destroy or molest the eggs or nests of any of the said birds at any time.
