Chapter 156.

AN ACT to repeal section three of chapter two hundred and thirty-two of the acts of the General Assembly, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, entitled "An Act to authorize the construction and maintenance of a line of telegraph from the House of Correction at Jessup's Station, in Anne Arundel county, to the Police Headquarters in Baltimore city, and from the State Penitentiary to the Police Headquarters in Baltimore city, and to abolish the office of Superintendent of the Telegraph Line therein created."

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section three of chapter two hundred and thirty-two of the acts of the General Assembly, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, entitled "An Act to authorize the construction and maintenance of a line of telegraph from the House of Correction at Jessup's Station, in Anne Arundel county, to the Police Headquarters in Baltimore city, and from the State Penitentiary to the Police Headquarters in Baltimore city," be and the same is hereby repealed, and the office of Superintendent of the Telegraph Lines authorized by said act be and the same is hereby abolished.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the said line of telegraph shall be transferred by the Board of Public Works to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, who shall keep and maintain the same at their own proper cost and expense, and are hereby invested with all the rights and privileges granted to telegraph companies under the general incorporation laws of the State in the working and maintenance of this line.
