Order election

SEC. 7. And be it enacted, That upon the passage of this bill the commissioners of Caroline county shall order an election as aforesaid by giving at least thirty days' notice, by publication in two newspapers in Caroline county, one of which shall be in said fifth district, and said commissioners shall appoint judges of said special election the same as in other elections authorized by law.

SEC. 8. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the clerk of the Circuit court of Caroline county to certify under his hand and the seal of the court the number of votes cast for and the number of votes cast against the law, as shall appear by the returns made to him, and he shall cause the same to be published in two newspapers in said county, one of which shall be in the fifth district.

of which shall be in the fifth district.

Sec. 9. And be it further enacted, That if a majority of votes cast in said election district shall be for the stock law, then the first, second, third, fourth and fifth sections of this act shall apply to said fifth district; the same shall take effect sixty days' from the first publication of the clerk's certificate as aforesaid.

Sec. 10. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
