

**Chapter 162.**

AN ACT to repeal section one of article thirty-six of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Estrays and Vessels Adrift," as the same was amended by the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, chapter three hundred and fifteen, and to repeal sections two and three of the same article as they were amended by the act of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, chapter one hundred and seventy, and enact the following in lieu thereof.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section one of article thirty-six of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Estrays and Vessels Adrift," as the same was amended by the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, chapter three hundred and fifteen, and sections two and three of the same article as they were amended by the act of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, chapter one hundred and seventy, be and the same are hereby repealed, and the following sections enacted in lieu thereof:

SEC. 2. The owner or occupant of any enclosure who may find any horse, cow, sheep, hog or other domestic beast trespassing on the said enclosed property may deem the same an estray, and shall immediately, or within a reasonable time thereafter, cause to be inserted in some newspaper published in the county where such estray shall have been taken up, once a week for two successive weeks, a notice of such estray, with a description of the same, and the location of the enclosure on which said estray was taken up, and the name of the owner or occupant thereof, and shall cause written or printed copies of such notice to be set up in not less than three of the public places in the neighborhood.

SEC. 3. If there be no newspaper published in the county where said estray shall have been taken up, or if the value of said estray shall not exceed ten dollars, the newspaper publication provided for in the foregoing section may be omitted; provided, that written or printed notices be set up as required
