

machine belonging to the Washington County Water Company shall be stopped, obstructed, impaired or injured.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That upon information given upon oath or affirmation to any justice of the peace of Washington county of any violation of any of the provisions of this act, he shall issue his warrant, to be directed to the sheriff or any constable of said county, for the arrest of the offender or offenders, and to bring such offender or offenders before said justice or any other justice of the peace of said county, and upon conviction thereof the said offender or offenders shall be fined not less than five or more than one hundred dollars, together with the costs of the proceedings, to be taxed as costs in other criminal proceedings, one-half of said fine to be paid to the informer, and the other half to the Washington County Water Company; and in case of the non-payment of such fine and costs imposed by said justice, the said offender or offenders shall be committed to the county jail for a period not less than three days or more than fifty days, or until such fine and costs are paid.

Issue warrant for arrest.

Fines—how disposed.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted*, That in addition to the remedy and punishments provided for in section seven of this act, the Washington County Water Company is authorized and empowered, by informations or petitions filed in the name of the Washington County Water Company, to apply to the judge or to any judge of the Circuit Court for Washington county, in term time or vacation, for an injunction to restrain and prevent the nuisances and evils intended to be prevented by this act, no matter by whom or under what authority committed.

Whom to apply.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
