

collected by an action of debt before a justice of the peace of said county, in the name of either of the said sanitary officers, for the use of the County Commissioners of Baltimore county. The said county commissioners shall expend money collected therefrom to the payment of the expenses of said sanitary officers.

Not to obstruct or resist

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That if any person shall knowingly obstruct or resist either of the said sanitary officers in the execution of the power to them given, or in the performance of the duties enjoined on them by this act, such person shall be deemed to be guilty of a misdemeanor; and, upon indictment and conviction in the Circuit Court for Baltimore county, shall be fined not less than fifty dollars or more than three hundred dollars, or imprisoned, at the discretion of the court, for not less than one month nor more than sixty days.

Police to execute orders.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the police officers of Baltimore county to execute all orders of either of the said sanitary officers, so far as they may relate to the sanitary condition of Woodberry and vicinity, Towson town and vicinity, Waverly and vicinity.

Infectious diseases.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That in case of any epidemic, contagious or infectious diseases, the county commissioners shall be empowered to send one or all of said sanitary officers to that locality where said epidemic exists, for which services they shall receive no further compensation.

Expenses how paid.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That all necessary expenses incurred by either of said sanitary officers under the direction of the county commissioners as aforesaid, in the discharge of their duty, shall be paid by the Commissioners of Baltimore county.

Effective.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from its passage.
