

Fourth ward. Fourth Ward. Beginning for the fourth ward at the foot of Muir street; thence with Muir to Pine street; thence with Pine to the southern line of the town; thence running and binding with the southern and eastern limits of said town to the creek; thence running and binding with the creek to the place of beginning.

Fifth ward. Fifth Ward. All that part of said town located in East Cambridge shall constitute the fifth ward.

Taxes—how applied. 36. The County Commissioners for Dorchester county shall, on the first day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and annually thereafter pay to the commissioners of said town the sum of four hundred dollars out of the taxes levied and collected for roads in said county, to be applied by the said town commissioners for corporate purposes.

Term of office. 37. There shall be five commissioners for said town, who shall hold office for two years from the date of their election, or until their successors are duly elected and qualified, one of whom shall be elected by ballot from each of said wards by the qualified voters of said wards respectively, and who shall be at least twenty-five years of age, and a *bona fide* resident of said town for at least twelve months, and of the ward in which he is elected at least six months next preceding the date of his election, and shall also possess in his own right, or in the right of his wife, real or leasehold property in said town of the assessed value of two hundred dollars.

Qualifications. 38. The male inhabitants of said town above the age of twenty-one years, who have resided in said town for twelve months, and of said wards for sixty days next preceding the date of election, shall possess the qualifications of electors of commissioners for said town; the qualified voters in each of said wards shall, on the third Wednesday in June in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, between the hours of twelve o'clock M. and two P. M., and in like manner every two years thereafter, elect by ballot five persons of known integrity, experience and sound judgment, to be commissioners of said town; each ward by the qualified voters thereof voting separately to elect one of said commissioners.
